

Sayyid Al-Hakeem reiterates managing Iraq's diversity, means to meet regional, world countries



Sayyid Ammar Al-Hakeem, head of Al-Hikma National Movement, met the Free World Organization delegation, which included representatives from Canada, Iceland, the United Kingdom, and the United States on Sunday, 19/2/2023.
