

Sayyid Al-Hakeem: Iraq Underwent Changes Over the Past Two Decades, Now Reaps Its Sacrifices Rewards



Sayyid Ammar Al-Hakeem, Head of the National State Powers Alliance, welcomed Dr. Mohammad Al-Hassan, the Special Representative of the UN Secretary-General in Iraq, to Baghdad, wishing him and the UN mission success in their endeavors. His Eminence emphasized the importance of international organizations in supporting Iraq's experience and helping it move forward. H.E. pointed out that Iraq has undergone significant changes over the past two decades, and is now accumulating positive outcomes and reaping the fruits of the sacrifices made by its people from all communities.

Sayyid Al-Hakeem stated that political projects are now taking a national direction, with differences shifting from being ethnic or sectarian to political within each community.
